One of the nation's most iconic historic landmarks is George Washington's Mount Vernon. Set on stunning grounds, a visit to this estate offers more than a history lesson. George Washington's Mount Vernon is a former plantation of United States first president George Washington and his wife Martha. Located Fairfax County overlooking the beautiful Potomac River.

With a private guide, you can explore the stunning grounds and learn about the history of the state and the life of George Washington. You may see the Mansion itself, the Tombs - George Washington died at Mount Veron in 1799. His wish was to be buried in the estate. A new brick tomb was built after his death and in 1831 his remains were moved into the newer tomb. The Gardens - the estate has four different gardens. Each garden served its' own purpose. Today's visitors can stroll through all of Washington's four gardens. Visitors Center & Museum offers access various exhibitions and films to further learn and explore.

A visit to George Washington's Estate is a bucket list item and offers a very special experience relevant at any time.

2025 George Washington's Mount Vernon is undergoing preservation work. It is still possible to visit. The grounds are open with several temporary exhibition outdoors. The mansion is fully closed and not open for visitors.
