Brooklyn REVOLUTIONARY HOTSPOTS

Brooklyn, one of New York City's five boroughs, is the most populous with over 2.7 million residents. In recent years, it has become a trendy and up-and-coming area, featuring modern condos, million-dollar townhouses, and a vibrant food, art, shopping and culture scene. It's a great place to visit to get a break from Manhattan.

In addition, Brooklyn also boasts a rich revolutionary history. The Battle of Long Island, also known as the Battle of Brooklyn, took place on August 27, 1776. It was one of the largest battles of the Revolutionary War and a costly defeat for the Continental Army. Despite modern development, many historic sites and monuments have been preserved to tell the story of Brooklyn's past and the events that took place.

On this tour, you'll visit Prospect Park, home to the Dongan Oak Monument, which honors the trees cut down by American forces to slow the British advance. You'll also see the Lefferts Historic House, an old Dutch farmhouse. Other significant sites include The Old Stonehouse and the story of the Maryland 400. Additionally, you'll visit Fort Greene Park, the site of the Prison Ship Martyrs' Monument, which commemorates the thousands of men and women who died on British prison ships provide deeper insights into the sacrifices made during the war.

This tour offers a unique opportunity to explore both the historical and the contemporary aspects of Brooklyn, providing a diverse and enriching tour experience.
