Central New Jersey, particularly the Trenton and Princeton areas, is home to some of our nation's most fascinating events in revolutionary history, featuring the site of Washington's iconic crossing of the Delaware, numerous battleground sites, landmarks, and museums.

In the comfort of private vehicle , traverse the sites from George Washington's famous crossing of the Delaware River, December 25th, 1776, through the battles of Trenton and finally, the Battle of Princeton, January 3, 1777. Your historical interpreters will explain the American, British, and Hessian military actions in the villages and surrounding farmland. This tour is the remarkable story of these "Ten Crucial Days" that infused new life into the American quest for independence at a time when all hope for "The Cause" seemed lost.

You will hear about people of diverse backgrounds, with varying religious practices – Quaker, Presbyterian, and Anglican – and with complex views on loyalty to the Revolution or the King. Hear how the terrain, weaponry, and weather influenced how the battles were fought and how they disrupted the lives of the local citizenry. See where armies marched, fought, and struggled to survive on an otherwise peaceful landscape while the course of human history hung in the balance.
