HONOR OUR NATION'S Herces IN WASHINGTON, DC

Honor our Nation's amazing heroes while in Washington DC. The capital city and surrounding areas have a myriad of attractions, museums and memorial paying tribute to service members and their families – both veterans and those on active duty. These places can be visited on Veteran's Day or in another day of the year – Honoring those that served is always the right thing to do!

Explore the National Mall and the most visited war memorials. See the Pillard neoclassical style DC War Memorial, a solemn tribute to Washington, D.C. residents who gave their lives during World War I. Take a short stroll in Pershing Park, located beside the historic Intercontinental The Willard. This newly established World War I Memorial displays elegant fountains and lush greenery offering a peaceful space for reflection. Walk through the iconic World War II Memorial, followed by visits to the Korean War Veterans Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and the Vietnam Women's Memorial—each honoring the courage and sacrifice of those who served to protect the nations and its interests. A stop at the moving American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial, the Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial situated near the Department of Education, and the U.S. Navy Memorial will be included.

The experience will end with a self-guided visit to National Museum of American History one of the must visit Smithsonian Institutions. Museum of American History holds an extra ordinary collection of over1.7 million artifacts that help tell the story of America's past. The museum portion of the tour is self-guided; however, suggestions for notable exhibits can be offered.

EXPERT ADVICE:

Should the group have additional time, – a visit to Arlington Cemetery is highly recommended as a profound way of honoring the memory of those that have perished while serving their country throughout the years. Highlights of the visit include the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Arlington House, U.S Coast Guard Memorial, The Memorial Amphitheatre and John F Kennedy's gravesite. While visiting Arlington Cemetery you may also get the opportunity to see Iwo Jima – The US Marine Corps War Memorial as well as see part of historic Alexandria. Additional 3–4 hours. Requires walking.
